# COURSE PROGRAMME

## WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

This course is all about grammar rules, and you will put them into practice too! You will review key grammar structures and learn how to apply them confidently. “Aha!” moments will motivate you to dive further into the German language.

In 5 modules, we not only look at essential grammar structures for beginners but also discuss key learning techniques and tools to accelerate your learning progress as much as possible. Task-based and communicative activities will ensure a highly effective approach to learning grammar.

- you have learned basic vocabulary on your own and now finally dare to tackle grammar structures. In this case you should be familiar with grammar terminology: verb ending, prefix, etc.

This course is not suitable for complete beginners with no prior knowledge of German.
